

**CITY OF PRINCE GEORGE**  
**BYLAW NO. 8372**

**A Bylaw of the City of Prince George to amend "City of Prince George Sign Bylaw No. 7202, 2001".**

**WHEREAS** "City of Prince George Sign Bylaw No. 7202, 2001", as amended, regulates signs within the City, including Political Signs related to elections;

**AND WHEREAS** Council deems it desirable to amend "City of Prince George Sign Bylaw No. 7202, 2001";

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the City of Prince George, in open meeting assembled, **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That "City of Prince George Sign Bylaw No. 7202, 2001" is hereby amended by deleting Section 9.1.f. in its entirety and substituting it with the following:

"9.1.f. Political Signs provided that an encroachment agreement has been entered into with the City for those Signs over 1.5 m<sup>2</sup> (16 ft.<sup>2</sup>) in area, in accordance with Section 9.2 of this Bylaw, and provided further that Political Signs shall not be placed or permitted to be placed in a road right of way or on other City Public Land except:

- i) in relation to local government and school elections and by-elections, from the first day of the nomination period until three days after general voting day;
- ii) in relation to provincial elections and by-elections, from the time the writ of election is issued until three days after general voting day;
- iii) in relation to federal elections and by-elections, from the time the writ of election is issued until three days after general voting day;
- iv) in relation to federal or provincial referenda or plebiscites, from the day that the text of the question is approved by the federal Parliament or by the provincial Legislature, as the case may be, until three days after general voting day;
- v) in relation to local government referenda or plebiscites, from the day that the text of the question is approved by Council or the board of the Regional District of Fraser-Fort George by bylaw or resolution, as the case may be, until three days after general voting day;
- vi) in relation to provincial recall or initiative campaigns, from the day that an application for recall or initiative is approved by the Chief Electoral Officer for British Columbia until three days after the final disposition of the matter; and
- vii) all such Political Signs are deemed to be the property of and to have been erected, placed, installed, displayed or maintained by the Person or Persons whose name or names are displayed, thereon, in addition to the applicant for the applicable encroachment agreement."

- 2. That the Mayor and Corporate Officer are hereby empowered to do all things necessary to give effect to this bylaw.
- 3. That this bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "City of Prince George Sign Bylaw No. 7202, 2001, Amendment Bylaw No. 8372, 2011".


READ A FIRST TIME THIS THE 25<sup>th</sup> DAY OF July, 2011.
