

CITY OF PRINCE GEORGE

BYLAW NO. 7666

A Bylaw of the City of Prince George to authorize the appropriation of monies from the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund to General Operating Revenue to fund lease finance purchase payments for mobile equipment, as per the year 2004 budget approved by Council.

WHEREAS, the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund has been established by "Equipment replacement Reserve Fund Bylaw No. 7150, 2000";

AND WHEREAS there is an unappropriated balance in the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund of \$2 009 435, which has been calculated as follows:

Balance in Reserve Fund at December 31, 2003 \$2 009 435

AND WHEREAS "Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund Bylaw No. 7150, 2000" stipulates that monies in the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund may be used for the purchase of mobile equipment including periodic payments that are required as a result of using the lease financing purchase option to acquire the equipment;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Prince George, in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The sum of \$443 000 is hereby transferred from the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund to General Operating Revenue to fund lease finance purchase payments for mobile equipment, as per the year 2004 budgets approved by Council.
2. Should any of the above amount remain unexpended after the expenditures hereby authorized have been made, any unexpended balance shall be returned to the credit of the said Equipment replacement Reserve Fund.
3. This bylaw may be cited as "Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund Transfer Bylaw No. 7666, 2004".
